



Working age poverty rate by gender









Oppression is Everywhere

Overt	Covert	Internalized
Open & observable Target is aware of intention, & action Perpetrator is observable	Hidden, often subtle Target may not realize intention, not readily obvious Second guessing	Member of oppressed group believes & acts out bias against their own group or other marginalized people

Prejudice:

A judgment or opinion that is formed on insufficient grounds before facts are known or in disregard of facts that contradict it. Prejudices are learned and can be unlearned.

Privilege:

Unearned advantages, favors, and benefits to members of dominant groups at the expense of members of target groups.

Power:

The ability or official authority to decide what is best for others. The ability to decide who will have access to resources. The capacity to exercise control over others.

Targets

 Members of social identity groups that are disenfranchised, exploited, and victimized

Agents

 Members of the dominant social groups privileged by birth or acquisition, which knowingly or unknowingly exploit and reap unfair advantage over members of groups that are targets

Allies

 A person whose commitment to dismantling oppression is reflected in a willingness to: Educate oneself; Learn from; Listen to; Reflect; Collaborate


Economic Equity: fairness in economics especially in regard to income, wealth, taxation, and the social safety net.






