// hat is SNAP Outreach?

Wildfire through the contract with ADES works with state and local agencies, advocates, employers, community and faith-based organizations working on SNAP outreach and/or application assistance committed to using a holistic approach to address hunger.

ho can join?

Non-profits (faith-based, food banks, health centers and more) or government agencies working in the community on SNAP outreach and/ or application assistance. Organizations looking to join should already provide a service and be operational for at least a year.

HOW'S THE PROGRAM FUNDED?

* Partners receive reimbursement for 40% of expenses on allowable SNAP activities.

Reimbursable activities may include:

- SNAP eligibility pre-screening
- SNAP application assistance
- Providing eligibility information regarding SNAP
- Salaries and benefits of personnel involved with SNAP
- Office supplies, postage, and travel necessary to carry project goals
- Space lease or rental costs

Partners receive training on:

- Pre-screening
- Application Assistance
- SNAP Eligibility
- Navigating the HEA-Plus website
- Policy and Regulations updates
