The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP, formerly food stamps) is the nation's most effective anti-hunger program.

In LD-01, 40.2% of households earn below \$50,000 annually and may be eligible for food assistance programs like the reduced price co-pay for school meals.

*Note: The average SNAP issuance in Arizona in 2024 was \$362.79/household/month, according to the 2024 DES Family Assistance Administration Monthly Statistical Plan Bulletins. AzFBN multiplied this average by the number of SNAP households in each legislative district and multiplied the total by \$1.54 to estimate the impact of SNAP dollars infused into the local economy each month. This multiplier effect is explained by The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and the Economy: New Estimates of the SNAP Multiplier (USDA 2019).
